

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Friday, Dec. 29, 2023, to Sunday, Jan. 7, 2024, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

- Friday, Dec. 29**
