

## LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Tuesday, Oct. 1, to Tuesday, Oct. 8, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD answered more than 300 calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

- Tuesday, Oct. 1**
- **Lewiston Road/Mountain View Drive, traffic complaint** – 911 complaint; wine bottle in roadway creating a hazard. Patrol responded.
  - **5800 block of Ward Road, suspicious activity** – 911 call; female observed on video urinating on the building. Patrols checked areas with negative results; officers to do periodic checks.
  - **700 block of Center Street, domestic disturbance** – 911 caller said the ex-girlfriend broke a door and removed jewelry. Patrols spoke with both parties; no burglary occurred per LPD, only a verbal argument earlier. Report taken.
  - **N. Kline/Saunders Settlement roads, MVA-property damage** – 911 call; vehicle in a ditch, unknown if occupied. Patrol contacted the registered owner who apologized for leaving vehicle and not retrieving it. Patrol arranged vehicle tow; registered owner cited for failure to use designated lane, failure to signal stopping, speed not reasonable or prudent, and for stopping/standing on pavement.
