PROPERTY OWNERS

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FOR REPAIRS TO RENTAL UNITS

- Property must be within Erie County **EXCEPT** for the City of Buffalo, Towns of Tonawanda, Amherst, Cheektowaga, Hamburg (and villages within)
- Property taxes must be up to date
- Property insurance must be in effect
- Cost of repairs cannot exceed \$15,000 per unit
- Properties with up to a maximum of 6 units are eligible
- The property owner must provide 10% or more of the rehabilitation cost
- For a period of seven years, rents charged to low/moderate income tenants cannot exceed the fair market rents established for Erie County as determined by the federal government.
- **Sample eligible repairs include:** All work required to correct code and/or ordinance violations. Replacement of building systems in danger of failure. All energy-related repairs (storm windows, insulation, etc.) Handicapped accessibility improvements.
