

## LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

- \* In-house baseball & softball fee for residents is \$80.00. (\$120 for non-residents.) T-Ball and coach pitch fee \$50.00. (\$90 for non-residents.) There is a 20% discount for each additional child when registering at the same time.
- \* Registration fee is non-refundable.

\* Anyone signing up after March 22nd will be charged a \$20.00 late fee per participant (\$40.00 for non-residents) and placed on a waiting list. Registrants after March 22nd cannot be guaranteed a uniform due to manufacturer's availability.
