I have been rather busy lately with helping with inquiries about historical records what my projects are for the coming season. I have been informed the Lewiston Lions Club is donating two decorative trees to be planted in the Oakwood section of the Village Cemetery to replace those lost to the ravages of time in memory of those who repose in its hallowed ground.

My next project – two, in fact – is to place a permanent flagpole to honor all who served our country from Lewiston. I have inquired about the pricing and placement. I have been given permission to place one in Oakwood, and I would also like to place a praying angel statue next to the bronze plaque and memorial benches to complete my park setting project.

I have been volunteering my time to maintain and preserve the most historic cemetery in the county. I hope to make these projects a reality in time for Memorial Day, so they may be dedicated to those who repose there.

I need to raise \$1,700 to acquire and install the flagpole, which the VFW has assured me there will always be a flag flying

from it; and \$300 for the praying angel statue to stand in perpetual guard and complete my vision of a parklike setting to be enjoyed by all who come to visit their loved ones and reflect on life itself.

I have acquired a number of items for the museum collection showcasing the history of our area. There are some new pieces of artwork in the main hallway and a small display of items from Lewiston estates. All are on display for the public to enjoy, as is the museum collection. It is currently open to the public by chance or appointment. Viewings are available by contacting me to set an appointment.

I have been very fortunate that I have been able to complete my current projects through the generosity of donations that I have received to make them a reality. To those who have donated to my projects, I am eternally grateful. I look forward to making these projects a reality by May.
