

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, May 6, to Tuesday, May 14, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD responded to more than 400 calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

Monday, May 6

- **University Drive, Niagara University campus, assist** – Officer requested a weapons search of a room; no weapons found.
