

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Tuesday, June 18, to Monday, June 24, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD answered more than 300 calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

Tuesday, June 18

- **2600 block of Ridge Road, MVA-property damage** – 911 caller reported a semi had struck a low hanging line, possibly power-related. Line now entangled in the vehicle; patrol and National Grid responded.
- **4800 block of W. Eddy Drive, assist public** – Caller reported foot-deep water and electrical pinging on the first floor of an apartment building. LPD and fire responders on scene.

County Sheriff's Office receives corrections division reaccreditation from NYS Sheriff's Association

Submitted by the Niagara County Sheriff's Office Sheriff Michael J. Filicetti announced the corrections division of the Niagara County Sheriff's Office has achieved reaccreditation from the New York State Sheriff's Association. In April 2024, accreditation assessors conducted a thorough review of the Sheriff's Office and determined our agency was in full compliance with all 166 standards set forth by the Sheriff's Association. Some of these standards include administrative practices, operational procedures and training re-

quirements, as well as the jail's medical department standards. Filicetti said, "Receiving this reaccreditation stands to affirm that the Niagara County Sheriff's Office is a professional agency, meeting the standards set forth by the New York State Sheriff's Association accreditation program. I am extremely proud of the men and women of the Sheriff's Office for continuing to lead the way in this endeavor." The Sheriff's Office has been an accredited office since 2001, and this recent reaccreditation is valid through 2029. In addition, the Sheriff's Office continues to maintain accreditation standards in the criminal division, communications division, civil division, emergency response team and forensic laboratory.
