

## LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, Sept. 1, to Sunday, Sept. 8, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD answered 310 calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

### Monday, Sept. 2

- **N. Eighth/Onondaga streets, assist public** – Patrol reports stopping to assist a male who had crashed his electric scooter. Male stated he was travelling across a crosswalk and struck a pothole, resulting in a fall. Male declined EMS assistance; patrol provided a courtesy ride home for the male and his scooter.
- **Lockport/Walmore roads, traffic complaint** – 911 caller reported an Audi all over the roadway. Vehicle located by patrol; female driver stated she was very inexperienced behind the wheel. No other issues reported by patrol.
- **100 block of Swain Road, check welfare** – 911 caller reported a male family member on the property going through valuables and wanted him to leave. Courtesy ride home provided by patrol.
- **5200 block of Green Road, fire** – 911 caller reported a building on fire; flames seen. Patrols and fire responders on location; unconfirmed brush/rubbish fire extinguished.
- **LPD patrol activity** – Calls of officer initiated. Vehicle/traffic stops throughout the village and town for motor vehicle violations. Patrols issued eight warnings to drivers for violations.

### Tuesday, Sept. 3

- **5300 block of Townline Road, disturbance non-domestic** – 911 caller reported a neighbor was outside, taking pictures of the caller's children while they were waiting for a school bus. Patrols advised the complainant that the neighbor in question was on his own property and no crime had been committed. Officers also ad-

ressed concerns by the caller.

- **Ridge/Model City roads, MVA-injuries** – 911 caller reported a semi-truck on its side and a male driver exiting the vehicle. Patrols, State Police, fire and EMS responders and DEC staff all on location. Officers said that 75 gallons of diesel fuel and engine oil were leaking from the vehicle; roadway closed for cleanup.
- **Raymond/East Eddy drives, traffic complaint** – 911 caller reported a school bus had run a stop sign on the first day of school. Caller provided school bus number to patrol; LPD to contact Lewiston-Porter bus garage on said complaint.
- **Tuscarora/Saunders Settlement roads, accident hit-run** – 911 complaint; patrols responded.
- **5900 block of Hyde Park Boulevard, MVA-property damage** – Caller reported a vehicle had jumped the curb, struck a tree and was sitting on the front lawn. Driver left the scene prior to patrol's arrival. Witnesses said the vehicle had been travelling west on Hyde Park Boulevard when it crossed into the oncoming lane, jumped a curb, and ran over a speed sign and tree. The vehicle continued, dragging the sign underneath and came to a stop on the front lawn. Photos of vehicle and driver provided to patrol for positive ID. Officers later found the vehicle hidden in a backyard and attempted to contact the driver; negative results reported. Vehicle towed; investigation continuing.

### Wednesday, Sept. 4

- **5800 block of Buffalo Street, suspicious activity** – Officer initiated call. Caller reported a broken window and graffiti on the rear of a building. Patrol responded; neighbors to check cameras for a timeframe. No report at this time.
- **2300 block of Upper Mountain Road, criminal investigation** – Caller reported an email received, possibly violating an order of protection. Officers said the email seeking a response by the caller's ex had come from a bank

and no violation had occurred.

- **4600 block of Model City Road, assist public** – Caller reported a suspicious package in the mail that she did not order. Patrols found the package contained plant bulbs; all OK.
- **Upper Mountain Road/Callan Drive, traffic complaint** – Anonymous caller reported a blue Ford pickup all over the roadway. Patrols located the vehicle; male cited for driving while intoxicated and third degree aggravated unlicensed operation. Appearance and uniform traffic tickets issued for Lewiston Town Court.
- **400 block of Ridge Street, check welfare** – 911 caller reported a female on the apartment steps, possibly impaired. Patrols responded; female stated she was on her neighbor's porch smoking "due to the beautiful view." Officers advised the female to use her own residence to enjoy the view and avoid disturbing others late at night.
- **LPD patrol activity** – Calls of officer initiated. Vehicle/traffic stops throughout the village and town for motor vehicle violations; three drivers cited with uniform traffic tickets issued for Lewiston Town Court. Patrols issued five warnings to other drivers for violations.

### Thursday, Sept. 5

- **4000 block of Creek Road, LPD office, forgery** – Officer initiated call. Patrol reported a walk-in complaint for a Social Security number that was hacked. Report taken.
- **4900 block of Indian Hill Road, accident hit-run** – 911 caller reported a three-vehicle accident, one vehicle left the scene. Officers said vehicle No. 2 was travelling north on Indian Hill Road and was struck by vehicle No. 1 while making a left-hand turn. EMS responded; all parties signed off. Vehicle No. 1 secured; accident report taken.
- **5100 block of Bronson Drive, traffic complaint** – 911 caller reported a subject who was speeding down the roadway; verbal ex-

changes occurred between the two parties. Officers responded.

- **Center Street/Portage Road, traffic complaint** – Officer initiated call. Caller reported 30 motorcycles blocking traffic and riding on the sidewalk. Patrols responded.
- **900 block of Center Street, MVA-injuries** – Officer initiated call. Off-duty patrol reported a pedestrian vehicle accident with injuries. Driver said a male pedestrian was riding a bicycle when he flipped over the handlebars and fell prior to making contact with the vehicle. Subject later taken to the hospital for evaluation/treatment. Driver cited for aggravated unlicensed operation, third; uniform traffic ticket issued for Lewiston Town Court. Report taken.
- **400 block of Barton Drive, suspicious activity** – 911 caller reported four to five individuals in their 20s parked a vehicle in front of a neighbor's residence, then walked behind the caller's house. Subjects found to be Canadian visitors who were trying to access the border crossing. Subjects advised by caller and left area. Extra patrols requested.
- **LPD patrol activity** – Calls of officer initiated. Vehicle/traffic stops throughout the village and town for motor vehicle violations; 10 drivers cited with 20 uniform traffic tickets issued for Lewiston Town Court. Patrols issued six warnings to other drivers for violations.

tables. Officers responded.
