News publisher buys Island paper

Purchase of the weekly Grand Island Dispatch was announced last week by Mrs. Charles E. Hewitt Jr., president of Tonawanda Publishing Corp. Tonawanda Publishing owns the daily Tonawanda News, and two other weeklies: the Kenmore Record-Advertiser and the Riverside Review.

Mrs. Hewitt said no immediate changes were contemplated in the Grand Island Dispatch, which has offices at 1601 Stony Point Road. The Dispatch, a tabloid-size paid newspaper, and its companion Grand Island Shopping Guide, a free-distribution paper, blanket the Grand Island community. It is produced by the photo offset process.

Tonawanda Publishing purchased the Dispatch from Rodney and Sumner F. Hall. Rodney Hall has been publisher of the newspaper. The Grand Island Dispatch was founded in March 1944 by Oliver Howard.

"We are happy to accept the responsibility of serving Grand Island residents through their weekly newspaper," Mrs. Hewitt said. "Grand Island has a rich history, a delightful present and a highly promising future, of which we are pleased to be a part."

Islanders have good neighbor policy

The Neighbors Foundation of Grand Island originally came about when members of the Island's Rotary Club learned of troubles an Island family was undergoing and decided to help them out. In this case, the breadwinner had been sick for a long time and there was expensive surgery and a hospital stay to further burden the family. Their savings had been depleted and the situation was serious indeed. ...

The Neighbors Foundation formally incorporated in 1973 and is funded through money donated by people in connection with two projects supported by the Foundation each year: a dinner dance usually held at the Buffalo Launch Club; and an appeal around Christmas for residents to forego mailing holiday cards and donate the money saved to the Foundation. Last year's drive netted \$700, noted Mr. William Pinkow, president of the group.
