## Democrats sweep in Lewiston

Cota elected mayor,  
 Coppins & Collesano to Village Board

Change is coming to the Village of Lewiston.

On Tuesday, residents chose Democrat candidate Dan Cota to be the municipality's next mayor. He defeated incumbent Republican officeholder Anne Welch by a vote of 366-294.

Joining Cota will be fellow Democrats Tina Coppins – elected to her second term – and Leandra Collesano, who is a first-time elected official.

Coppins was the top vote-getter with 433; followed by Collesano, who had 378. Deputy Mayor Vic Eydtt, a four-term board member, finished third with 293 votes. First-time candidate Rob Nichols finished with 198 votes.

Come July, the traditionally GOP-leaning Village Board will have a Democrat majority.

Though that's significant, the three newly elected leaders said political party wasn't what determined the results.

"I think that building a campaign around listening really resonated with everybody here, and people want to be heard – and now they will be," Cota said.

Coppins said, "I really don't think it's

## Grand Island School District budget passes on 2nd vote

The Grand Island Central School District budget passed Tuesday.

Superintendent Dr. Brian Graham expressed his gratitude to the 4,001 voters who came to the polls at Grand Island High School for the second vote on the 2026-27 academic year.

"First of all, I'm really grateful that Grand Island showed up tonight for our students and for our schools. This is what

community looks like: 4,000 voices and one shared belief in our students," Graham said. "It's also important to recognize the Board of Education for listening to the results of the first budget, making changes, and appreciating what the community was telling us about the tax levy."

The budget (proposition one) passed by the vote of 2,650-1,340, and proposition two (vehicle purchases) passed by the vote of 2,529-1,423.

Democrat/Republican; I think it's what the people want. It's not a party. We're a small village – it doesn't matter. It's what is needed and what we want to do."

Collesano said, "I totally agree. It wasn't about the party; it was about time for change here in the village, and we're representing that, and we will deliver it."

The reorganizational meeting will take place at 6 p.m. Monday, July 6, at the Red Brick Municipal Building, 145 N. Fourth St.

"I think the biggest thing is getting the community more involved in every decision that we make; bringing them in early, bringing them in often, and let-

ting them have real input into the decisions that we make," Cota said.

Coppins said, "I think it's going to be bringing the community in by using video and streaming our meetings, so they can sit at their house and watch it. Right now, we have nobody show up – but we want people here; we want to move it to the gym!"

Collesano said, "We definitely campaigned on transparency, and it's been lacking up until today – and that will change once we're sworn in."

Election officials reported 645 people voted in person, while 26 absentee ballots were accepted.

There was one write-in vote for

mayor, Ed Lilly, who is running in next Tuesday's Town of Lewiston primary election opposite Supervisor Steve Broderick.

Four years ago, when Welch bested challenger and former trustee Claudia Marasco (by a 52-point margin, 367-315), a total of 633 people voted in the Red Brick Municipal Building gymnasium. Fifty-four absentee ballots were submitted.

In 2018, there were 721 votes cast, with Welch besting former deputy mayor Bruce Sutherland by three votes.

The current results are unofficial until approved by the Niagara County Board of Elections.

## GICSD: Graham thanks community

Graham said the Board of Education took the vote of May 19 into consideration, when the first budget proposal was defeated by 1,352-1280, and the proposition to purchase vehicles was defeated by the vote of 1,334-1,280.

"Thirteen hundred people told us that they were upset about the tax levy increase of 2.69%," Graham said. "The board listened to that and took out \$500,000 from the original budget and provided a 1.5% tax levy increase, which is a significant change. I think that

the community appreciated that.

"We are absolutely thrilled with the result because it protects the programs that we have for our students. Let's not forget that, on May 22, Business First identified Grand Island as the No. 1 stable neighborhood in Western New York. That included the graduation rate in our high school. It included the poverty rate of the Island and the housing stability. Those three factors, those three indexes, resulted in 14072, Grand Island, as ranking No. 1 in Western New York. Having strong

schools is part of that formula, and we are thrilled that Grand Island came out with such a positive result for tonight's revote."

When asked about the possibility of the school district's presenting another capital improvement project to the voters, Graham said, "We have a new board, and they are starting this July. It will be part of the conversation. The entire board will workshop the first capital project, redline it, and probably present to the community a tax neutral capital project. At least, that's the plan."

# Relay For Life features superheroes and everyday heroes

The 25th anniversary of Grand Island's Relay For Life, held June 6 at Town Commons, featured better weather than anticipated, along with a few superheroes and a surprise donation.

Spider-Man and a few other superheroes were present to greet both adults and children. Along with the superheroes were the quiet heroes who are there every day to support and care for cancer survivors, explained Relay For Life Co-Chair Lynn Dingey.

"Our stars of today's celebration are our cancer survivors," she said. "We can't forget the caregivers who have a supporting role in our survivors' journeys. We're all caregivers in a way. Some are the caregivers that are there for treatments, doctor visits, and all the day-to-day crappy stuff that comes along with cancer. Some of our friends are family members that our survivor leans on for moral support, laughter or even an escape from the day-to-day of cancer. Some of our caregivers send love, hugs and prayers from near and far.

"Sometimes, out of the blue, you get a call that makes you one of the most important people in a cancer survivor's journey, all because you took the time to take part in a Relay-sponsored bone marrow drive 10-plus years ago, way back when Relay was still at the high school. That phone call changed the life of two individuals that have since met and have become friends and are now considered family. Those people are Kim (Schopp Kalman), our co-chair; and her bone marrow recipient, Stu (Fugate)."

In 2022, Kalman donated bone marrow, after she was found to be a match with Fugate.

"I think this is my 20th year doing Relay," Kalman said. "I do run the basket raffle, but I'm also co-chair. If you all know Dan McBride, he was sick with leukemia. I got on the list to be a bone marrow donor. Whoever really thinks they are going to get that call?"

Shortly after the 2009 Relay For Life event, a bone marrow donor drive was held, with a number of people traveling to Roswell Park to get swabbed as potential bone marrow donors. McBride, who was Relay For Life's honorary survivor in 2009, died of mantle cell lymphoma in 2015.

"Stu and I were talking about this the other day. I got the call in,

I think, late August of 2022," Kalman said. "I surgically donated on Nov. 23, 2022, in Washington, D.C. They shipped my bone marrow overnight to M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas, where Stu was waiting for my bone marrow. It took a year for us to legally be able to know each other. When we did, it was Christmas day of that following year that we had our first phone call. And now, we are like family. He is from Kentucky, and he is here today to celebrate this wonderful day and to be here for all of us. He is Relay's biggest supporter since I've met him. So, come on up and just give me a hug in front of everybody."

Fugate, however, gave Kalman more than a hug. This resident of Beulah, Kentucky, carried with him a gift of \$1,000 to Relay For Life from himself and his wife, Mindy, as well as \$2,000 worth of Southwest Airline gift cards for Kalman so that she could travel to visit her daughter and grandchildren, all of whom were present at Relay For Life.

"(The donation) was a surprise," Kalman said. "In fact, I found out that he had talked to a bunch of people within Relay ... our committee, my friend Joni Golda, who had gone with me to the surgery. He had talked to her, and they knew I fly a lot to see my grandkids and my daughter, and they thought that would be the best idea. He was looking for ideas. I had no idea about it, though."

"Kim is a blessing," Fugate said. "When I went through this process, I always hoped that (the donor) would have Kentucky ties. (Kim's) grandmother and grandfather are within an hour's drive of my home, so I thought that was pretty unique and pretty nice."

"It was quite the cool combination of how God picked me for him, and he was the right person for me," Kalman said.

"One more thing to add to this wonderful story," Kalman said.

"This November coming up, Stu is going back to MD Anderson for another checkup and bloodwork. Dr. Amin Alousi has the picture of Stu and me on the wall in his office. I'm going to meet him this November and fly down. I'm going to Stu's appointment with him.

"Dr. Alousi is world-renowned in the whole leukemia world. He was the one who did Stu's surgery back in 2022. He (Stu) is going back in November, and he asked that I go with him because the surgeon would like to meet me. So, I'm going to take a trip to Houston in November to go to that appointment with him. It's pretty exciting. I'm excited."

Fugate, who explained that he speaks "fluent hillbilly," said he was excited to be on Grand Island for Relay For Life.

"Y'all are wonderful to hold this event," Fugate said.

"I may be a little biased because I live here, but I do love this event so much," said Dilyn Harrison of the American Cancer Society. "We really appreciate anyone who did rain dances this week and switched the weather because that's amazing."

"It is because of what you do that we're able to serve this community. Last year alone, based on donations we were able to make in Western New York, we were able to provide over 4,000 rides to treatment in Western New York. That's huge. That should never be the reason someone doesn't get

their treatment. That's because of your support."

Harrison noted Relay For Life is "about to invest \$2.58 million in cancer research. That again is thanks to your donation and your support."

Dingey described the event as a success.

"I think Relay went really well this year," she said. "The weather forecast had us changing things up in the days prior to our event. We actually loved the final result and plan to keep some of those changes for next year. Our Survivor Celebration was busy all day and there was a great crowd most of the day."

"I was hoping our 25th anniversary would bring past Relayers together, and I definitely saw some folks, survivors and participants I haven't seen since our days at the high school. The survivor tent put together an amazing picture display from Relay over the last 25 years."

The superhero theme was also

a big hit, Dingey said, noting the kids, especially, enjoyed interacting with superheroes.

"They had the chance to meet several superheroes. We saw kids in costumes and others with superhero face paint. It was fun to see them all together for the costume lap," she said.

When asked about how she felt about the 25th anniversary of Relay For Life and her hopes for the future, Dingey said, "There are not many communities across the country that have been Relaying for 25 years. I'm proud to be able to say our community is one of them."

"My hope is that our community will continue supporting Relay For Life so we can celebrate our survivors, remember those that we've lost, and to fight back against cancer any way we can."

Town of Niagara Supervisor Sylvia Virtuoso said she received a call earlier in the month from Hochul's secretary.

Virtuoso had reached out to the governor's office asking for any leads on grants, remembering a similar situation when the Fashion Outlets of Niagara had expanded, and the office being helpful.

"They were very helpful at sending me links for grants

and everything," Virtuoso said. "And then, to my surprise last week, the governor called me and said that she is well aware of how budget constraints are and how difficult it is to fund this equipment, and she was happy to grant us \$2 million."

The new specialty firefighting engine has been ordered, but will not be ready for a couple of years, Virtuoso said.



# Investing in future of fishing in Niagara County

The future of fishing in Niagara County depends on two important ingredients: healthy fish populations and the next generation of anglers. This month, both are receiving a boost thanks to the efforts of dedicated volunteers and community organizations throughout the region.

The Niagara River Anglers Association's pen-rearing project in Youngstown has wrapped up another successful season, producing outstanding results that will benefit the Lower Niagara River and Lake Ontario fishery for years to come. The annual volunteer-driven effort is designed to improve the survival and return

rates of hatchery-raised Chinook salmon and steelhead by holding them in net pens along the Lower Niagara River for several weeks before release. During that time, the fish acclimate to local water conditions and develop a stronger imprint on the river, increasing the likelihood they will return as adults when it is time to spawn.

This spring, approximately 115,000 Chinook salmon called the north dock in Youngstown home for five weeks. The fish experienced exceptional growth during their stay, reaching an average size of 50 smolts per pound at release – nearly



three times their original size, and the largest average release size achieved since the project began nearly 25 years ago. The steelhead also posted impressive growth rates, nearly doubling in size during the rearing period. Larger smolts generally have a better chance of survival once they enter the open waters of Lake Ontario, making the pen-rearing project a valuable investment in the future of the fishery.

The success of the program is made possible by the volunteers who dedicate countless hours each spring to feeding fish, maintaining pens, monitoring fish health, and ensuring the project operates smoothly. Their efforts help sustain one of North America's premier salmon and trout fisheries, attracting anglers from across the continent and generating significant economic benefits for local communities.

Just as important as raising fish is inspiring the next generation of anglers who will enjoy and protect these resources in the future. June offers several opportunities for young people throughout Niagara County to experience the outdoors through youth fishing contests and fishing clinics.

I've always believed that one of the best things we can do for our children is get them outdoors and away from cell phones, tablets and computer screens. Fishing teaches patience, responsibility, conservation, and an appreciation for nature while creating lifelong memories with family and friends.

Several youth fishing events are scheduled throughout the month, including the recent contests in Youngstown and the Town of Cambria on June 13; the upcoming Wilson Conservation Club event on June 20; and the popular "Hooks for Harry" event in Olcott and the Town of Niagara contest on June 27. Many of these events provide fishing equipment, bait, prizes, refreshments, and experienced volunteers who are eager to help young anglers learn the sport.

These outings also provide an excellent opportunity for parents, grandparents and guardians to learn alongside their children. Every year, families discover that fishing is an activity they can enjoy together for a lifetime.

While volunteers and community organizations continue to invest in the future of our fishery, anglers on the water are currently dealing with one of the most challenging periods of the fishing season. June is often considered a transitional month in Niagara County. Smallmouth bass are on their spawning beds, salmon and trout are adjusting to constantly changing water temperatures in Lake Ontario, and walleye are just beginning to show up in respectable numbers following their spring spawn.

As if those challenges were not enough, the annual arrival of drifting green moss in the Lower Niagara River creates another obstacle for anglers trying to keep their presentations clean and ef-

fective. Add it all together, and June can test the patience and persistence of even the most experienced fishermen.

Does that mean you should put the rods away and wait for better conditions? Heck no.

Successful anglers simply adapt. Fishing earlier in the day before water levels rise can often help reduce the amount of moss in the river. Topwater presentations can be effective, allowing anglers to avoid much of the drifting vegetation while still targeting aggressive fish. Sometimes the best strategy is simply changing locations altogether.

One of the greatest advantages of living and fishing in Niagara County is the incredible diversity of opportunities available. If conditions are difficult on the Lower Niagara River, anglers can shift their focus to local harbors, ponds, inland waters, or head west to Lake Erie. Smallmouth bass, walleye, panfish, carp and other species provide excellent alternatives while waiting for conditions to improve elsewhere.

That diversity is what separates Niagara County from many fishing destinations around the world. Within a short drive, anglers have access to the Niagara River, Lake Ontario, Lake Erie, harbors, tributaries, ponds, and inland waterways. There is almost always somewhere to fish and something willing to bite.

Whether it's volunteers raising salmon and steelhead for future fishing opportunities, organizations introducing children to the sport for the first time, or anglers adapting to seasonal challenges on the water, Niagara County continues to demonstrate why it is one of North America's premier fishing destinations. June may require a little more patience and flexibility, but anglers willing to adjust can still find excellent action. Sometimes the toughest conditions produce the most rewarding days on the water.

## Twin Cities sets firemen's parade, first responders appreciation day

The fire departments and volunteer fire companies of the Twin Cities are having their annual parade on Saturday, June 20. This parade event first started in 1880 and has been held every year since then.

The Columbia Hook and Ladder Co. No. 1, celebrating its 150th anniversary, will lead the fire companies in the line of march. Columbia was founded May 7, 1876, by 20 leading citizens of the Village of North Tonawanda, the first fire company on the north side of the Erie Canal. Step off time is 1 p.m. The route will be in North Tonawanda, starting at Oliver Street and the 10th Avenue area, marching north on Oliver Street to Ward Road, turning at Ward Road and to the Gratwick Hose Co. grounds.

Chief Douglas Orlowski and City of Tonawanda Fire Chief Joseph Briggs will lead the parade inspection in front of the Gratwick Hose hall. Joining them will their assistant fire chiefs, the mayors and common council of both cities, county legislators and other city officials and guests.

Career firefighters of both departments will be part of the parade. Volunteer fire companies from each city are: North Tonawanda – Columbia Hook & Ladder No. 1, Active Hose No. 2, Live Hose No. 4, Rescue Fire No. 5, Gratwick Hose No. 6 and Sweeney Hose No. 7. From Tonawanda – Union Hook & Ladder No. 1, National Hose No. 1, Delaware Hose No. 2 and Niagara Hose No. 3.

Also invited are fire companies of neighboring communities from both counties that have been part of mutual aid responses. From Niagara County are St. Johnsburg, Adams, Frontier,

Bergholz, Shawnee, Sanborn, Pekin and Niagara Active. From Erie County are Brighton, Sheridan Park and Grand Island. Twin City Ambulance and Tri-Community Ambulance will also be represented.

This is a special parade that has gone on in the Tonawanda's community for nearly a century and a half. The public will enjoy the marching firefighter units, senior volunteers, fire apparatus and bands along the entire parade route.

The public is invited to join the general admission afterparty of food, beverages and musical entertainment on the Gratwick Hose grounds at 110 Ward Road. Admission fees will be \$13 per adults and children 12 and older, and \$5 for children under age 12. Tickets can be purchased at the door only; no presale.

St. John's is one of only a few remaining board-and-batten carpenter gothic churches with an active congregation in Western New York, and is listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places

## Youngstown Business and Professional Association celebrating 50-year anniversary

Then and now: A look at village businesses from 1976-2026

The Youngstown Business and Professional Association was incorporated in 1976. At that time, the YBPA president was Victor Szarejko, DDS. Originally, the purpose of YBPA was to be able to offer health insurance to various businesses in Youngstown. That job later went to the Lewiston Chamber of Commerce, but the YBPA continued on as an association serving the community.

In 1976, there were two physicians, two dentists and an attorney available in the Village of Youngstown. There was even an appointed "Welcome Wagon Hostess" to welcome newcomers. At one point, there was a Marine Midland bank in the form of a trailer in the B-Kwik parking lot. Soon, there was an HSBC bank on second street, which then became First Niagara

Bank then finally KeyBank (which closed in 2018).

The many businesses then and now have undergone many changes. There were 49 listed businesses in 1976. Not all were YBPA members. Today, we've grown to 82 members. Not all are brick and mortar.

Cheryl Irish-Butera was here during that time frame, as was Dotty Riordan, who helped with this timeline. In the 1970s, there was a restaurant known as The Fyfe & Drum located at 440 Main St. It offered fine dining as well as live music on occasion. Unfortunately, there was a fire and the restaurant was closed. In its place today is the Hill of Beans Coffee Stop, with many newly built apartments in the rear.

In 1976, there was Comerford's Riverview Inn, offering fine dining and a view of the Niagara River. Following the death of Mr. Comer-

ford, the restaurant closed and today is a fitness center, Hardened Art Tattoo Studio, offices and some available B&B rentals.

What was then Dirty Harry's restaurant, at 930 Lake Road, today is Bandana's Bar & Grill. Cheryl's uncle, Jim, and her aunt, Jackie (Emma) Lampman, owned and operated Jimmy's Pizzeria at 425 Main St., which, today, is the very popular Youngstown Village Diner.

At 431, then was Emma's Ice Cream (part of Jimmy's Pizzeria). That, today, is Petey's Treats ice cream shop. Back then, there were two businesses - Captain's Galley at 412 Main St., and 418 Main St., Phillip's Place.

In the 1980s, those two buildings were combined to become Brennan's Irish Pub, then The Irish Rose, and finally The Mug and Musket. 400 Main St., for years (per Dot-

ty), was a grocery store called Reeds Market, which then became Jo Marie's Hairstyling and then became Nadine's clothing shop and later Ashker's Coffee Shop, The Youngstown Galley, and currently the Sister and Brother Children's Apparel clothing store.

At 311 Main St., was Nolan's Exxon, which later became the location of Main Street Pizzeria. At 201 Lockport St., was then Ventry's Automotive, which became Heritage Auto, and today is A/M Automotive.

Then and now, located at 128 Lockport St., is Dan and Lucy Realtors. In 1976, housed at 120 Lockport St., was the Town of Porter offices and Village Library, which, later (for 30 years), was Dr. Rama Bojedla and, for a short time, became Happy Tails dog grooming following the

Lopez, star of "Saved by the Bell," "Pacific Blue" and "Access Hollywood," has become a fixture in the TV rom-com genre, having starred in a half-dozen over the past six years. He led the 2025 Western New York-filmed "The Christmas Spark" and served as executive producer on "Chasing Christmas."

"The people are so nice here; always very welcoming," Lopez said. "The film commission has been great. They really roll out the red carpet. It's beautiful, and we have a lot of fun coming out here."

"The great thing (is) I've always wanted to work with Mr. Danza here, who I've always looked up to. Great, great guy – just as nice as he is off camera, as well."

"And it's kind of a bonus, because this weekend I get to see him perform again, which I've seen him perform in L.A., but he's going to be at the Seneca Niagara Casino Friday and Saturday. ... It's a great show. It's a one-man show. He's singing, he's dancing – it's fun."

Danza, the star of iconic sitcoms "Who's the Boss?" and "Taxi," has recently been a part of the more serious "Power" franchise ("Power Book III: Raising Kanan").

"I was in the office, and I saw the posters from (Lopez's) other movies that he starred in here, and I was thinking, 'I think I could fit into this. This is pretty good,'" Danza said. "I'm also a big fan of Mario's. I mean, I know he goes on about me, but I'm also a very big fan of his. Everything he does."

"And now I met his son – and he's out! The kid's in," Danza joked about Mario's son, Dominic, who also stars in "Rewinding Christmas." "Wait 'til you see this kid. He's going to steal the picture."

Lopez, who is producing this feature, said, "It's very much a family affair. There's three generations represented. My actual son is playing Tony's grandson, which is a lot of fun. There's going to be some singing and dancing, a little element about that."

"My leading lady is a very nice lady named Taylor Kalupa. She's been working on a show right now, coincidentally, here in Buffalo, so there's a lot going on here in Buffalo. It worked out. She's going to be here for like a month or so."

"And then this other nice young lady, an actress named Natalia Cigliuti, she's playing my sister. I love the family element there."

In "Rewinding Christmas," "My character comes back home to kind of visit his dad. He was up for a big promotional job. It didn't exactly sort of work out. He has a 'come to Jesus' with his son. ... He's now a single father. He meets this lady who he's kind of now interested in, and kind of staying. When he does that, his father decides to kind of sell the place and throws everything into a bit of a monkey wrench and turmoil," Lopez said. "I don't want to give too much away. We all end up kind of figuring it out; and it's all about family and love at the end of the day, and kind of focusing on priorities and what's important."

He added, "I love the whole holiday element. And again, representing family. And Tony's an icon and represents all these great values. That's what we try to represent in this film."

Danza said, "I own a nightclub. ... I certainly identify with this performer who happens to own his own place and is trying to keep it alive."

Lopez noted, "We wrote it, actually, with Tony in mind, and after seeing him perform back in L.A. And if you come this weekend, you'll get to see kind of a taste of what you're going to see in the film, too, because that's sort of mirrored that with this character."

### Danza doing double-duty

At 8 p.m. June 19-20, Danza will present "Sinatra & Stories" inside The Bear's Den Showroom at Seneca Niagara Resort & Casino.

"People don't know, but I knew Frank Sinatra," Dan-

za said. "I ended up somehow, in a crazy turn of events, being around him. And so, I wrote this show about it. We do a lot of the great music that he made famous, and there's tap dancing."

"I bring out my secret weapon: my ukulele. 'Oh yeah, oh baby.' I'm telling you – and by the way – romantically, that thing's a ray gun! (laughs)"

"It's a show," Danza said. "I like to think of it as like those old TV variety shows where you have a host and a lot of different acts. Well, I'm the host and all the different acts!"

"It's fun," Lopez said. "I've seen him in person. He puts on a great show. It's so much fun. I'm going with my family. A lot of us here are going to go."

"It's required!" Danza said.

"You should definitely check it out," Lopez said.

### Hollywood returns to Lewiston

Danza and Lopez were working inside and outside the house at 155 S. Fifth St., a historic Lewiston property currently for sale through Licensed Real Estate Salesperson Dana Fideli of Keller Williams Realty WNY.

"This house right here – I don't know where else you're going to find this," Danza said.

"It's been here since 1817 – that's crazy!" Lopez said.

Fideli, who was on set, said, "It was amazing. Everybody on the whole production set was so accommodating and so great."

"The homeowners for the listing, they were there. They came into town with their boys to see it all go down, and they were really, really excited."

"Everybody was just wonderful on set."

"It's thrilling. It's exciting for them to come to our little hometown of Lewiston – and to have one of my listings featured in a movie is pretty neat."

Fideli said the film crew reached out to her a few months ago when scouting locations.

"They wanted to come and meet me and take a walk through of the house and see if it might be a good fit for them," she said.

"It's a huge house, so it worked out really well for the movie."

"In the Village of Lewiston, especially, we have so many of these historical homes that are just filled with character," Fideli said. "This one is an oldie. It was built in 1817. As I mentioned, it's a large home – it's almost 4,000 square feet with six bedrooms and three-and-a-half baths. It's got some really great character that comes along with the older homes."

"They have all of the original wide plank hardwood floors. My sellers, they put so much time into kind of bringing this home back to life. I helped them buy it a few years back, and they fixed it up. It was going to be their forever home, and plans changed, and so now, unfortunately, they're going to sell, and hoping that another family loves it just as much as they do."

On the sidewalk and across the street, residents tried to catch a glimpse of the stars.

As thrilling as it was for them, Danza said he felt the same way.

"You know, I've been doing this a long time and this is very exciting," he said. "Playing the casino is a thrill."

Buffalo Niagara Film Office Film Commissioner Tim Clark said, "The location manager, Erika Frase, scouted a lot of different locations, and then when the producers came in, Erika and myself and (producer) Mark (Roberts) went through; and the minute he rolled into town, he realized this is it – it's a very perfect, small-town-America look for a Christmas movie. I think the locations and the quaintness of the community were the things that really drove the producer to fall in love with the place."

Oftentimes when a production crew visits a community like Lewiston, the name in the movie winds up changing. For example, in the Hallmark Channel's 2025 picture "A Newport Christmas," the Village of Youngstown doubled for Newport.

However, Clark noted, "They did change this from a fictitious location to Lewiston – the Village of Lewiston – so, Lewiston itself becomes a character in the story. It's pretty cool."

"Rewinding Christmas" is directed by Jody Hahn from an original screenplay written by Megan Henry Herzlinger and "Chasing Christmas" director Brian Herzlinger.

This won't be the first feature to shoot in Lewiston. In 2015, filmmakers Tony Glazer and Summer Crockett Moore made "The Morning the Sun Fell Down" (also known as "Morning Sun" and "After the Sun Fell") at the Barton Hill Mansion and Apple Granny Restaurant. The movie starred Neil Bledsoe, Chasty Ballesteros, Danny Pudi, Diana DeGarmo, Joanna Bayless and Lance Henriksen, with a cameo by former mayor Terry Collesano.

doctor's retirement. Today it's a brand-new business called Three Little Hens Baking Company.

The Ontario House, aka "Stone Jug," has always been a hotel, restaurant and bar. The Jug is the oldest standing building in Youngstown. It was once owned by the Wojcik family, but now is owned and operated by the Costello family.

Ye Old Fort Inn, at 110 Main St., was well known for great dining but, today, has been turned into a duplex. 200 Lockport St. was B-Kwik, but then became Melloni's Market, and today is the site of Griffon Brewery. In 1976, 214 Lockport St., was the location of Barnum's Pharmacy, which later became Rite Aid (which closed

in 2024). Then, on the east end, there was Danny's Restaurant and Ice Cream, which, for some years, was the Baptist church and today is Youngstown Marketside. In the former Rite Aid space plans are being discussed for a new retail shopping store.

At 409 Main St., was Dan's Grooming and Style for many years. Today, it is the location of Peace of Mind Wellness & Counseling Services. At 140 Lockport St., was The Settlement Cleaners of Youngstown, which was also a laundromat. Today, it is the location of Legacy X Fitness. In 1976, located at 113 Lockport St. (originally the village post office), was Yankee Spirits Liquors & Wines, which relocated to North Tonawanda and, in 2003, the store became

Anchor Spirits & Wines. At 435 Main St., was then Youngstown Design Center but, today, it is the location of The Dory Trading Post.

On the waterfront back then was Pierce Marine, which offered ferry service to Niagara on the Lake in Canada. It was a small motorboat that offered that service for a mere 25 cents and, for 50 cents, you could bring your bicycle! (9/11 changed that). Now at that location is The Wicked Worm LLC bait and tackle shop. RCR Yacht's Inc. was then and still is located at 223 Lockport St. The Youngstown Yacht Club was and still is located at 491 Water St. In 1976, the Youngstown Cold Storage, at 701 Nancy Price Drive, was active, but that has since been demolished and now is the site of the new Riverview Landing con-

miniums.

The Youngstown Business and Professional Association has always been supportive of the local events such as "Christmas in the Village," the Labor Day parade (including the once-popular Labor Day field day), even the Youngstown community picnic and fishing derby.

Currently, the YBPA sponsors the Neil Riordan St. Patrick's Day Parade in March, the Here Comes Summer Street Dance & Car Cruise in June, the YBPA golf tournament fundraiser and, in September, we celebrate the Youngstown/Porter Business of the Year and Community Service Award ceremony.

Last year, we made donations to the Inter Community Services

food pantry in Ransomville for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Every year, we apply for the William G. Mayne, Jr. Business/Community Enhancement Program. The money is matching funds put toward beautification of brick-and-mortar projects. One of those projects was the pretty blue and white Christmas snowflake lights that adorn Main Street, Lockport Street and inside Falkner Park.

This year, we will be making improvements to the Falkner Park pavilion in time to celebrate the summer free concerts organized by Dotty and enjoyed by everyone!
