# Former Sentinel carrier gives back to his community

Quinn Miller, a Lewiston-Porter sophomore, continues his community donations

A Lewiston-Porter High School sophomore continues to make an impact on his community.

Quinn Miller started collecting cans and bottles when he was 9 years old. As a Niagara County Tribune-Sentinel carrier, he would ask clients every week to leave cans and bottles outside of their homes for him to collect. It took him a year to gather the funds to donate his first check to Care-n-Share, a River Region non-profit organization supported by Inter-Community Services.

Two people motivated Quinn on his donation journey: his mother, Meg; and Angelo Sarkees.

Quinn learned about his great grandma's soup and had the idea that his mother could teach others how to make it at the food kitchen. From there, his mother introduced him to the concept of food deserts.

"I dropped a can of food on the floor and it kind of popped in my

head," Quinn said. "You said you turn these in for money. What if we gave that money to people who need it?"

Sarkees was someone Quinn and his mother would see when they would deposit their cans and bottles. Known as "The Can Man," Sarkees took the money he collected and donated to places such as Care-n-Share and Community Missions. The late Sar-

kees founded Deposits For Food, through which he raised over \$100,000 for local nonprofits.

"He always joked that you (Quinn) were gonna take his place when he retired," Meg Miller said.

Quinn collected items and made donations to families during the COVID-19 pandemic. He provided 400 personal care items to Care-n-Share. Moreover, Quinn's grandmother crocheted bags and gave them to him.

"She made us these bags and said, 'Go take these; go make some money; sell them; you said you've got these fests coming up - do something with them,'" Quinn said.

Rachel Jolbert, who owns and operates the Lewiston Artisan Farmers Market, gave Quinn a table to sell the bags his grandmother made. Jolbert also promoted the bags on her social media to spark interest. Quinn and his mother called them "Shop-n-Share" bags and donated the money they made from those bags to Care-n-Share.

Serving the community since 2010, Care-n-Share offers multiple outreach programs: a food pantry that collects non-perishables and toiletries and in Ransomville; Wear-n-Share, a clothes closet located at the Lewiston-Porter Central School District office; and on the third Saturday of every month, Care-n-Share hosts a mobile food pantry. It also has a partnership with FeedMore WNY.

Quinn recently presented Care-n-Share's Rhonda Shiah with a check. She expressed her gratitude for donors like Quinn, who have consistently shown their support for the community.

Quinn, who also works with Lewiston Redemption, plans on raising even more donation funds.

"When word spreads, people will be inspired," he said. "I'm excited."



# Lewiston pickleball court location changing; town assessing Chamber building improvements

Improvement projects occupied much of the discussion at Monday's Lewiston Town Board session.

Among them, a new location for the pickleball courts proposed earlier by Supervisor Steve Broderick. He said the town's \$750,000 pickleball court project submitted for Niagara River Greenway Commission review in April included one pickleball court at Richard F. Soluri Park on the west end of the Portage Road plateau. A second pickleball facility would be located on the grounds of Lewiston No. 2 Fire Co. park on Saunders Settlement Road.

He said that, following the town's April meeting with the Niagara River Greenway Commission – plus input from Lew-Port Youth Football parents and recent election changes with the Village of Lewiston – the town is now considering pickleball at Pletcher Road Park instead.

Greenway officials are scheduled to meet on the project again in September.

This week, Broderick revealed a change in plans.

"When we went to the Greenway Commission for approval, the Greenway Commission's recommendation was we move them," Broderick said.

He noted commission members were concerned about the court's impacts to a nearby bird sanctuary on the plateau's west end and suggested a location further east. Broderick said he learned the location could also interfere with the Lew-Port youth football program that's nearby.

"The football players play up there; we had two meetings (with) the parents. They definitely voiced some concerns about losing territory, and we were going to clear some more area on the north end of the plateau," Broderick said.

He added, "With the new administration (in the village), we need to take a step back (on the plateau site) and put it kind of on the back burner and maybe revisit the plateau at another time."

Broderick said, "We still want to move forward with pickleball, so I'm going to make a motion

## Town of Lewiston primary: Lilly, Broderick headed for another showdown

**Town of Lewiston Supervisor Steve Broderick and challenger Ed Lilly each won a party line for the Nov. 3 general election on Tuesday.**

**Lilly beat Broderick in the race for the Republican ballot, winning by a margin of 523 (52.4%) to 472 (47.29%). There were three write-in votes.**

**Broderick bested Patrick Boettcher for the Conservative Party line, taking 68 votes (77.27%) to his opponent's 20 votes (22.73%).**

**Results are currently unofficial.**

**The Niagara County Board of Elections reported 5,629 ballots counted countywide, out of 54,909 eligible voters (10.25% voter turnout).**

**Both Election Day and early votes are fully reported, while vote by mail/early vote by mail ballots are partially reported.**

**Lilly defeated Broderick in the June 2025 primary. Broderick won the election in November 2025.**

that we change the location from the plateau to Pletcher (Road) Park with the pickleball court."

He stated the Pletcher Park option includes a nearby pavilion and would "save us a little bit of money" overall, while not disrupting the second pickleball court planned for the Lewiston No. 2 site. Broderick also said the Pletcher Road location corresponds with the Niagara Greenway mission and would be "an appropriate use of Greenway funds."

Broderick's proposal was seconded by Councilman Bill Burg and approved soon after by a 4-0 vote. Councilwoman Sarah Waechter was absent.

### Chamber repairs

More projects discussed Monday included a town plan for repairs at the Upward Niagara Chamber of Commerce offices and welcome center at Academy Park. Broderick said the building, a former veterinary office that was moved and renovated about 15 years ago, is in need of significant repairs to its roof, doors and windows.

"We reached out to the chamber. When I was there last winter, there was snow coming in the windows, snow underneath their door, in their roof. You could actually see through the roof in small patches," he said.

Village of Lewiston Engineer Mike Marino spec'd out the building rehab project so as to put it out for bid. Broderick presented a proposal submitted by Walter Johnson Building Co. of Niagara

Falls for \$167,905 to cover the overall repair work. Included is \$111,000 for a new roof, along with one door and nine window replacements.

The numbers immediately caught the attention of Burg, a former town Planning Board member and a business owner working in construction materials.

"In my opinion, that's a lot of money to replace windows that are 20 years old," he said. "That's way above what the market generally bears for window replacements or roofing."

Broderick said the work with Walter Johnson would be a municipal contract with prevailing wages for the roof labor. In addition, the building's roof would be of a higher-price cedar shake-type material, which had to clear the village's Historic Preservation Committee criteria, along with other considerations on the historic building that drove up costs.

Still, Burg had questions.

"I'm saying the roof repair and for replacement of windows, that is way above the market," he said.

Broderick explained the town has been unable to secure bids for government municipal work projects, mentioning the no-bid responses he has faced for work

at the Lewiston Senior Center and a similar problem the Niagara County Water Department has been facing.

"We made a promise to the Chamber that we get them new windows and doors and a roof. We have the money in the H-98 (energy) account. I would like to move forward on it," he said.

Attending board members said they wanted an opportunity to further review the construction specs and costs. At Broderick's suggestion, the matter was tabled until the board's next regular meeting in late-July.

### In other news

•The town approved a \$5,375 Swann Road traffic study to be

performed by Invictus Civil Engineering of Lewiston. The work would entail an intersectional analysis of Swann and Model City roads "to identify and evaluate intersectional/traffic control deficiencies or potential improvements at the intersection."

Funding would come from the town's H-97 account for infrastructure.

•Town Highway Superintendent Mike Weiss reported on paving updates, as well as improvements planned at the Lewiston Dog Park. Weiss said paving was recently completed on Bronson Drive and, next up for crew work, is the Hillside-Orchard neighborhood, with milling to start July 14.

At the dog park, the board approved for \$13,600 in ready mix concrete construction to address muddy conditions at the entrances and other transit areas.

Funding will come from the town's H-97 recreation fund.

•Jeff Ritter, of the Lewiston Water Pollution Control Center, reported on ongoing work in the Morgan Farms neighborhood sewers.

"We're putting the Morgan relief sewer in," he said. "It's going to take a lot longer than we expected, but the guys are making great progress."

Ritter forecasted a late-July completion date.

**Bicycling and back pain**

It is fairly common for avid cyclists to complain of back pain. **The good news is that fixing the problem may be no more complicated than adjusting the bicycle seat.** According to a report in an issue of the British Journal of Sports Medicine, tipping the front end of the bicycle seat down by 10 to 15 degrees reduces the angle formed by the spine and pelvic bone and relieves back strain. The study assumed that back pain arose among cyclists when the angle is too large. Among the 40 cyclists whose seats were adjusted in this study, 37 reported an improvement in back pain.

Women should be aware to purchase a bicycle seat with a wider saddle to accommodate the larger distance between the pelvic bones. A bicycle shop can help you select the one that is right for you and adjust it properly.

## Second graders explore insect life at Eco Island

Eco Island is a place where Grand Island students have the opportunity to explore nature and overcome fears, said director Cyndi Booker.

Eco Island, which is owned by the Grand Island Central School District, is open three to five days a week from October to June.

On April 30, a group of second graders from Kaegerbein Elementary School visited Eco Island to learn about insects and other animals. They looked at insects through a magiscope, which is a type of microscope. They made models of bees, they heard about the life cycle of frogs, and they learned about birds.

"I hope that they develop an appreciation for nature," Booker said. "I want them to be able to ask questions and to really appreciate things. For example, some (children) might be fearful of some animals. I'd really like them to overcome those fears with knowledge. For instance, understanding how bees are and the difference between bees and wasps. Making sure they understand how impor-

tant bees are and the importance of insects in general, because a lot of kids are pretty squeamish about insects. However, when they take a look at them under a magiscope, all of a sudden, it creates a new world for them to take a look at."

Booker said Eco Island is designed to provide interactive learning for the students, as well as for the parents, who function as chaperones.

"It makes it more meaningful," Booker explained. "I think that every person actually benefits from a hands-on learning experience, both young and old. I make it my mission to try to make it as engag-

ing as possible. If we can make little model representations of what they actually see, it's going to stay more permanently with them."

Watching students experience nature at Eco Island is something Booker said she lives for. She said she likes to see "the joy on their faces when they ask questions and when they get excited about coming here. Especially when you hear them saying,

not just to me but to themselves, 'This is the best trip ever' or 'I'm having a great day.' They charge me up in that way. I guess you could say I live for that. I also get a lot of those kinds of comments from parents, too. 'I never knew that before.'

"Parents are the child's first teachers. So, if they can get excited about seeing things that their children are doing, that's going to be passed off to the entire family.

"But I also love the opportunity for kids, as well as parents, to teach me a few things, too. I'm not done learning."

## Erie County Sheriff's Office Report

## Be an educated boater: Know & follow 'rules of the waterways'

### Do not to leave safety at the dock this summer

As summer arrives in Erie County, boating season is officially underway. From the Erie Basin Marina and Canalside to the Niagara River and the scenic waters near the Point Abino Lighthouse, Western New York offers endless opportunities for residents and visitors to enjoy our beautiful waterways.

Just as motorists follow the "rules of the road," boaters and jet skiers must also understand and follow the "rules of the waterways" to ensure everyone stays safe on the water. I encourage all recreational boaters to understand the risks, know the laws, and be properly prepared before heading out this season.

New York state requires anyone operating a motorboat or personal watercraft who was born on or after May 1, 1996, to successfully

complete a state-approved boater safety course. Studies conducted by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators show that nearly 70% of boating fatalities involved operators who had never taken a boating safety course. A list of approved classes can be found at New York State Parks' website: parks.ny.gov/boating.

State law also requires all motorized watercraft to be registered through the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Whether your boat is powered by a gas engine or electric motor, registration is required regardless of the vessel's size. Erie County residents are encouraged to "Renew Local" by completing their boat registration at any Erie County Auto Bureau branch, helping keep a portion of those fees here in our

community.

To register a boat, residents must complete the required application and provide proof of identity, date of birth, and ownership. To schedule an in-person appointment you can visit [erie.gov/clerk](http://erie.gov/clerk) or call the clerk's outreach center at 716-858-8864.

Boaters should also remember that operating a vessel while impaired by alcohol or drugs is illegal and extremely dangerous. Alcohol remains a leading factor in boating fatalities nationwide, impairing judgment, coordination, and reaction time. New York state also imposes strict penalties for underage operators caught drinking while operating a vessel, including suspension or revocation of operating privileges.

One of the simplest and most

effective ways to stay safe on the water is by wearing a life jacket. Statistics show that the overwhelming majority of recreational boating drowning victims were not wearing one at the time of the accident. Wearing a life jacket – and ensuring every passenger does the same – can save lives.

Our waterways are one of Western New York's greatest summer attractions. By boating responsibly, following safety laws, and looking out for one another, everyone can enjoy a safe and memorable season on the water. Boat smart, boat responsibly, and have a safe summer.

# Lumberjack's excels at being deliciously different

Lumberjack's Waterfront Patio Grill is just different.

•The North Tonawanda restaurant is different in that its food quality and ambiance are award-winning. It's a multi-time winner of NFP's "Savory Summer" food contest, having taken titles for "WNY's Best Summer Dining Spot," "WNY's Best Hamburger" and "WNY's Best Fries."

•Lumberjack's is different in that it tries things – whether that be events for pet-lovers, or "We did try line dancing – only once" on the outside patio last summer, owner/operator Carol Tallichet said. "It didn't get many people, but it was fun. In fact, I partook. It was a whole lot of fun."

"We're open to everything and anything," she said.

That includes an all-day chicken wing offering, which debuted Tuesday and may return again this summer.

Patrons could purchase 45-cent wings – in any quantity – and have them flavored plain, mild, medium, hot, sweet chili, barbecue or garlic parm, with side sauces including blue cheese, ranch, sweet chili, barbecue, sweet and sour, and garlic parm.

•Lumberjack's is also different because Tallichet's goal continues to be preparing staffers to leave – to have seasonal workers so well-trained that they can seamlessly transition into their post-education careers.

Of course, there is a caveat with that last bullet point, and it's that people don't want to leave! Roughly 80% of the 2025 team returned this season.

"I've been here for nine years; it's my summer home," Manager Maddie McKie said.

She joined in high school – "I was 16 when I started. I started as kitchen prep; and then I learned the counter; and then on a very busy shift I had to learn how to cook and fill in for somebody. Then when I was old enough, I became a manager," she said.

Now, "Definitely one of the biggest things is making sure the customer's happy – and one of the first things we tell everybody is, when they are delivering food, make sure you ask if there's anything else they need;

or if they can get anything else; or if everything looks right," McKie said. "Definitely making sure the tickets match before the food leaves the kitchen, before we deliver the wrong thing."



Tallichet noted McKie also does scheduling and social media and is "very creative – extremely."

"Learning every position here has been super helpful," McKie said. "Being able to pop in wherever needed and be able to help people training that are new; knowing a little bit of everything."

"We make it a fun place to be," Tallichet said. "We have an employee night just before everybody leaves in August. We play games."

"We play life-size 'Jenga,'" McKie said.

"We do pizza and wings and something out of the ordinary that we don't carry. It's a good camaraderie," Tallichet said.

Lumberjack's is open from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily at 1000 River Road.

Again this season, patrons can expect to find an all-star selection of local summer favorites: Wardynski's hot dogs, Mineo & Sapio Italian sausage on Costanzo's Bakery rolls, and Anderson's ice cream – served from a vintage cooler.

Plus, Lumberjack's offers live music from 4-7 p.m. each Wednesday and Sunday. Upcoming performers include Slim Chance (June 28), Retro Phonics (July 4), and Brother James and Friends (July 12).

Oh, and don't forget "We're right on the water," Tallichet said.

Lumberjack's is a unique restaurant/marina combo with a deck that cantilevers right on the river and seats 160 people.

# LEWISTON NIGHT AT ARTPARK: Femmes of Rock founder NINA DIGREGORIO returns home to kick-start outdoor concert slate

Multi-instrumentalist has mastered rock classics in unconventional, fun way

Though Femmes of Rock founder/string leader Nina DiGregorio was nice enough to sit down for a full interview, a preview of her July 10 Artpark concert could simply be summed up by this statement:

You won't believe your ears.

Nina D. has taken some of the most iconic rock songs of all time – including “Comfortably Numb” (David Gilmour guitar solos) by Pink Floyd, “Do You Feel Like We Do” (full solos, talk box and guitar) by Peter Dinklage, “Stairway to Heaven” (Jimmy Page guitar solo) by Led Zeppelin, “Eruption” by Van Halen, “You Shook Me All Night Long” by AC/DC and “Limelight” by Rush – and reconfigured them for violin.

But that's only half of it.

When Nina D. and Femmes of Rock hit the stage in Lewiston, “it's not going to be like your grandmother's Beethoven,” she said. “You're going to see electric strings with singing – with us (DiGregorio, Christina Rose and Sarah Chaffee) singing the vocals with a rock band behind us – with a multimedia experience with video and lights – and it's going to be a full-on rock show with arrangements in a very unique way like you've never heard them of your favorite classic rock bands.”

As an added bonus, “We actually have a few of us who are, or used to be, local to the area – because sometimes those are the best musicians you can find.

“Our guitar player still lives in Niagara Falls. His name's Jason Neubauer, and he's one of the most absolutely virtuosic, bad@ss guitar players I have ever performed with, and I've played with a lot of famous

people over the years. So, he's with us not because he's local, but because he is the best person for the job. I mean, end of story – he's that talented musically.

“Our bass player (Michael Kelly) went to Kenmore East. He now lives in the Philadelphia area, where he's a professor of music, but he's originally from the Buffalo area.

“We also have some guest artists: our opening band, the Fabulous USA Band, and Second Hand News from the Buffalo/Niagara Falls area. And also, Michael Licata, who's going to guest on drums with us, also graduated from Kenmore East. So, a lot of us are semi-local. Our drummer (Jeff Tortora) is from Syracuse originally, so cousins in snow.

“I just feel like they're going to see a hometown group of people, mostly, but not because they're from the

hometown, because they are really that great of musicians. My band is amazing. Most of them currently play in Blue Man Group Las Vegas with us, but we travel all over the place.”

For Nina D., the inspiration for what she uniquely does first came when watching her father admire another world-class musician.

“It all kind of started when I was playing violin at Lew-Port,” she said. “I played – I think it was probably the middle-school orchestra at the time – and I saved up my money and bought my first electric violin on eBay. My dad had an old guitar amplifier sitting around at home. So, one day, my dad was watching Jimi Hendrix do ‘The Star-Spangled Banner’ at Woodstock, and I was like, ‘I want to try and do that – only I don't play guitar; I play violin.’ So,

I plugged my violin into his amp. I messed with all of the effects and patches and distortion and stuff like that. And when my parents came home from work the next day, I was like, ‘Hey, look what I could do – play like Jimi Hendrix,’ and that was kind of the beginning of the whole thing.

“And from there, I learned more guitar solos of more of my favorite players, until I could play a lot of them – until I could play David Gilmour and Jimmy Page and Eddie Van Halen and Alex Lifeson and numerous guitar players. And so, that's what I really loved. I loved classic rock music, but I played the violin, so that was really the only thing I knew how to do, was what I'm doing.

“And then, of course, as I got older and I started to work in the industry, I was hired as a violinist, and I would tour with people or perform on the Las Vegas strip in shows. But I'm just a violinist. The violin plays in the orchestra – they kind of back people up. Sometimes you take a solo, but it's really a backing job for a singer. I decided that I wanted the strings to be out of the pit orchestra and front the show. That was why I created the Femmes of Rock show, so that the string players were actually the stars of the show, and not just the decoration helping out the singer.”

Nina D. and Femmes have received rave reviews from the likes of Frampton, Five Finger Death Punch, Michael Anthony and Danny Seraphine. Together, they have shared a stage with Kansas, Bad Company, Ted Nugent, Cheap Trick and Lynyrd Skynyrd, while she has played with Stevie Wonder, David Foster, The Killers, Beyoncé and

Deep Purple.

Though Nina D. has performed around the world, the July 10 concert holds special meaning.

“I've never played at Artpark,” she said. “When we've come back to the area, we've played the Riviera; we've played UB; and we've played the Bears Den; but I've never played Artpark – even though I graduated on that stage and walked across it, graduating from Lew-Port. I've been to shows there when I've gone home to visit my family in the summer, but never played there myself; so, it's very exciting. First time.”

She added, “I'm really excited, because I've said many times, ‘Oh, I'm coming to play my hometown,’ but that meant Amherst or North Tonawanda or Niagara Falls. It never really meant my hometown. This is the first time I could actually say I'm playing my actual hometown of Lewiston, New York, where I was born. I know everybody there. ... My family is all there; my friends are there; teachers that I had growing up are there.”

Nina D. said, “I really miss just the small-town vibe, the safety of it, the restaurants, the people. Of course, my family and friends. And just that feeling of, ‘This is home.’ You can't duplicate that anywhere else.

“Vegas has been home for a very long time for me, and when I leave Vegas, I'll defend that, too. I'll be like, ‘Don't you talk crap about Vegas. I could go get my pants tailored at 2 in the morning if I want to here!’ This is still my hometown, but it's not the same as my hometown that I grew up in.

“There's just a safety and a comfort – like a warm hug – when I go back there every time.”

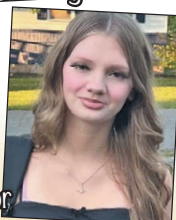

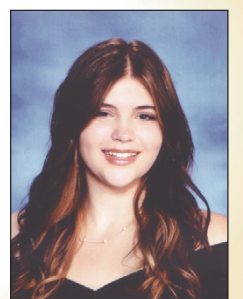

# Niagara Falls State Park unveils 2 new immersive exhibits

'Voices of the Falls,' 'Above the Roar' provide new ways to experience park



## Experience Niagara

Your Falls Adventure Starts Here

The New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, along with licensed concession partner Delaware North, recently celebrated the opening of two new attractions in the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Welcome Center in Niagara Falls State Park. "Voices of the Falls" and "Above the Roar" invite visitors to experience Niagara Falls through diverse perspectives and cutting-edge technology.

### 'Voices of the Falls'

The \$4.4 million "Voices of the

Falls" is a permanent interactive exhibit that explores the past, present and future of Niagara Falls – the park as well as the surrounding community – in the voices of those who have been part of its history. Featuring first-person perspectives, historical narratives, artifacts, hands-on interactive and video presentations, the nearly 5,000-square-foot exhibit highlights the cultural, environmental and personal connections that have formed the nation's oldest state park.

"Voices of the Falls"

Stories from the Indigenous who first inhabited the land to the Underground Railroad to the tragedy of Love Canal as well as the flora and fauna of the park are included and will provide visitors with a richer view of the park beyond the waterfall. Additional elements of the project include outdoor models, a lenticular mural and signage. The material covered throughout the exhibit is consistent with the principles of New York State Park's "Our Whole History" initiative.

"We are thrilled to open 'Voices of the Falls' and 'Above the Roar.' Together, these exhibits enrich the visitor experience and create new year-round opportunities for learning, exploration and discovery," New York State Parks Commissioner Kathy Moser said. "I am especially grateful for our partnership with the Seneca Nation, Tuscarora Nation, and Underground Railroad collaborators, whose contributions helped bring these stories to life. By sharing a more complete and inclusive history, these exhibits ensure that visitors gain a deeper understanding of the people, cultures and events that shaped New York and our nation."

Seneca Nation President J.C. Seneca spoke of the importance of preserving culture, heritage and language by sharing stories with others, and from generation to generation.

"We appreciate the opportunity for us to be here, to be able to educate, and for people to learn about who we are," he said. "Who better to tell our story than ourselves."

"It's an important story and there's a lot of history here," Seneca noted.

"Voices of the Falls" was designed by Haley Sharpe Design of the U.K. and Toronto and fabricated by Buffalo's Hadley Exhibits.

### 'Above the Roar'

"Above the Roar" is a fully immersive, multisensory virtual reality (VR) experience that takes participants on a thrilling journey around the most powerful waterfall in North America. Through exclusive aerial footage, motion-enhanced seating and immersive sound, participants will soar along the U.S. side of the Niagara River just above the rapids and then over the American, Bridal Veil and Horseshoe Falls before gliding through the gorge and plunging into the depths below. There, under

the water, they will encounter seven species of fish that are native to the river before returning to the brink of the American Falls and ending back inside the Welcome Center.

"'Above the Roar' offers a completely new way for people to experience Niagara Falls as part of their visit to the park," said Derek Zwickey, chief operating officer of Delaware North Parks & Resorts. "We are proud of our partnership with New York State Parks and thrilled that Delaware North could bring this attraction to life as another way for visitors from around the globe to experience Niagara Falls State Park."

Delaware North worked with MDSX, an award-winning experiential design and media production firm.

"Working with MDSX, we used cutting-edge virtual reality content to create a perspective that has never been accessible to the public – a cinematic, awe-inspiring journey that is as emotional as it is exhilarating," Zwickey said. "Every moment is designed to bring guests closer to the scale, power and beauty of Niagara Falls in a way that feels immediate and unforgettable."

### Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Welcome Center at Niagara Falls State Park

These installations complete the 28,000-square-foot visitor center that was opened by Gov. Kathy Hochul in December 2023. The welcome center features glass walls and a low roof to maximize views and connections to the falls. It includes new ticketing and information desks; new concession spaces; restrooms and associated support spaces; a rooftop PV array; special patterned glass to prevent bird impacts; green roof elements; and a separate restroom building. Enhanced site amenities include new, accessible paths; native plantings; and wayfinding elements.

The Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Welcome Center at Niagara Falls State Park complements the \$150 million revitalization of Niagara Falls State Park landscape. Launched in 2011, the Niagara Falls State Park landscape revitalization plan was a multi-year commitment to renew the park in a manner that better reflects noted park designer Frederick Law Olmsted's vision for the landscape. The plan renovated the park's major viewing areas including Luna Island, Prospect Point, Lower Grove, Three Sisters Islands, North Shoreline Trail, Luna Bridge and Terrapin Point with new pedestrian walkways, enhanced landscaping, new benches, light posts and railings.

The interactive Cave of the Winds pavilion, which highlights the natural and cultural history of Niagara Falls, opened in 2017. Removal of the Niagara Scenic Parkway (formally the Robert Moses Parkway) in the City of Niagara Falls provided unprecedented access to the Niagara Gorge by connecting the city to its waterfront for the first time in a generation. It was the largest expansion of Niagara Falls State Park since its creation.

Niagara Falls State Park is a state and national treasure. Created in 1885, it is the oldest state park in the nation, attracting over 9 million visitors annually.
