

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, Oct. 10, to Sunday, Oct. 16, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD reported 204 response calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

Monday, Oct. 10

- **5800 block of Garlow Road, suspicious activity** – Caller to 911 reported two individuals walked out of the woods and remained on the property. Security personnel on scene advised both parties to leave the property, however the subjects ignored their request and continued to walk around the property. Patrols responded.
