

## LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, Oct. 9, to Wednesday, Oct. 19, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

**Monday, Oct. 9**

- **Tuscarora/Plank roads, MVA-property damage** – 911 call; patrol responded, report taken.
