

RRG to provide access to NYS DEC's May 10 hearing on CWM

RRG has posted access for the public to watch or listen to the presentation of testimony at a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation hearing beginning Wednesday, May 10, regarding Chemical Waste Management's application to site a new, 6-million-ton hazardous waste and PCB landfill operation in the towns of Lewiston and Porter.

This hearing is specific to the topic of whether a new CWM toxic waste landfill operation would adversely affect the marketability of area agricultural products.

This is one of several hearings in the past year regarding CWM applications, which date back to 2003.

Significant issues include:

✓ Experts for the U.S. EPA and Niagara County disagree with CWM's groundwater contamination model. Niagara County is represented jointly with the Town of Lewiston, the Village of Lewiston and the Village of Youngstown.

RRG, the Niagara County Farm Bureau, the Lew-Port Central School District, Buffalo-Niagara River Waterkeeper and the Tuscarora Nation are also represented in CWM proceedings along with a local resident.

✓ Experts at Argonne National laboratory for the Army Corps of Engineers and also Niagara County disagree with CWM's selection of data to model contaminants released into the air. The Army Corps study comparing area wind data sources was commissioned for federal property adjacent to CWM.

✓ CWM's proposal to discharge

PCBs into the Niagara River is disputed as illegal.

There are also major disputes with CWM regarding radiological contamination on its property, as well as truck traffic and noise models, which will be the subject of future hearings.

Both EPA and New York state have determined there is no need to site a new toxic waste landfill, because there are 17 other such operations in the U.S. with capacity to handle the nation's needs for the foreseeable future.

The CWM site is located 10 miles north of Love Canal and one mile from all public schools for two towns. CWM disposal operations have been closed for nearly eight years.
