The two family attractions include a new "Fun Animal Rides" operator, as well as "Kid Zone," featuring a series of inflatable bounce houses for children to enjoy. They are set to open soon. Frozen D Lite will join other food court restaurants, in July, and provide menu offerings such as ice cream, bubble tea and boba, crepes and shakes. The restaurant will be situated next to Roadside Diner, which opened in May.
