City of Niagara Falls, which has a later county collection date, the amount is frozen as of April 15, and the payment deadline is extended to May 31.

“Many of the decisions on financial relief from COVID-19 come from Albany and Washington, but there are steps lo-

cal governments can take, and Niagara County wants to lead in this regard,” Andres said. “This is the second extension of this deadline and we will again reevaluate next month. We are also looking at other ways to help residents and businesses since tax postponement cannot go on indefinitely.”

Lewiston Tops adds to delivery service program, provides update on commodities

Lewiston Tops owner Anthony DiMino is adding an email option to the store's home delivery and pickup services. Customers can now email an order to adimino@topsmarket.com.

Delivery service is available from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. weekdays.

“Right now, Instacart is about five days behind. So, we've enhanced our delivery service by taking online orders,” DiMino said.

He added, “If they have their grocery list, then they can specify what they're looking for, and we'll shop it. If there's a question, we'll

call them. If not, it will be all taken care of.”

Orders also can be placed by phone at 215-1350.

Though there is no minimum purchase requirement, each order does have a delivery fee based on where the customer lives. For more information, visit <https://www.topslawiston.com/home-delivery-service/>.

“We were processing in our system – not Instacart – normally about 20 orders a day. Now, since this pandemic... we've been averaging about 50 orders a day,” DiMino said. Despite that increase, orders are typically shipping out

the same day or the next day. “We've added more staff, a second delivery driver, and we're doing between 50 to 60 orders a day.

“If we know we're not going to be able to do it within that day, we'll tell them that it will be the following day – which normally is not a problem.”

Commodities

“In regards to supplies and anything else, it's pretty much the same as it's been,” DiMino said. He noted cleaning supplies are “trickling in.”

With HART helping at-home seniors, services more important than ever

The current coronavirus (COVID-19) has changed the way all of us lead our daily lives. While taking precautions to avoid the virus and its pandemic spread, many of us also have the added emotional stress of managing the care of loved ones or friends living alone who are elderly or infirm.

HART (Home Assistance Referral Team) is an organization that has served the Greater Niagara community and adjacent areas since 1982. Our mission is to enable the elderly and infirm to maintain an independent lifestyle in their own homes by linking them with qualified and affordable assistance.

Services include health and personal care, skilled nursing care, respite for family caregivers, companionship, meal preparation, light housekeeping and yard work and errands.

Sources tell us that, instead of

admission to a hospital, assisted living facility or nursing home, more and more seniors are choosing to receive care in their homes. This is often referred to as “aging in place,” and allows those in need to be treated or helped in the security and privacy of their own living arrangements. As our senior population grows, more Americans are expected to take advantage of home health care.

The uniqueness of HART is that we are a free referral service. Our caregivers are prescreened through background checks, personal interviews, references and training verification. There is no fee to be registered as a caregiver, and also no charge to those requesting services. Cases involving long-term care insurance are also accepted.

Rate of pay for care or assistance is mutually agreed upon by the person requesting services and the caregiver or service provider. HART does provide guidance on recommended hourly rates.

For nearly 40 years, all operating costs incurred by HART are provided by charitable support from the generosity of individual and business donors, grants and proceeds from community fundraising events. No time in our history has this support been more important as we continue to meet the needs of the most vulnerable among us.


HART has remained open during this current health crisis and our care coordinators continue to respond to inquiries. We salute them and our nearly 300 caregivers who haven't missed a beat in providing dedicated assistance to those entrusted to their care.
