

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, April 19, to Sunday, April 25, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD reported 212 response calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

Monday, April 19

- **5300 block of Walmore Road, suspicious activity** – Caller to 911 reported at least one male and one female near vehicles. Patrol checked area with negative results; no damage or items found missing. A neighbor reported an individual in nearby woods with turkey calls.
