

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, Nov. 29, to Sunday, Dec. 5, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD reported 156 response calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

Monday, Nov. 29

- **2900 block of Saunders Settlement Road, assist** – Caller reported a vehicle in a ditch; unknown if occupants are in vehicle. Patrol contacted a towing service to remove vehicle.
- **5700 block of Lewiston Road, suspicious activity** – Patrol requested to assist New York Power Authority Security on a report of a suspicious male seen along the concrete wall by the baseball and lacrosse fields at Reservation Park. Patrols on location.
- **500 block of Colt Avenue, forgery** – Caller reported fraudulent charges found on a credit card after losing a wallet. Report taken.
- **N. Fifth/Oneida streets, traffic complaint** – Officer initiated call. Patrol on location for stop sign complaints.
- **Niagara Scenic Parkway, vehicle/traffic stop** – Call officer initiated. Driver cited for speed in zone; vehicle clocked at 101 mph in a 55 mph zone. Uniform traffic ticket issued for Lewiston Town Court.

- **I-190, exit 25 A, MVA-injuries** – Passerby/caller to 911 reported two vehicles were involved, one vehicle in roadway, southbound. Airbag deployment in both vehicles. Report taken.
- **1500 block of Saunders Settlement Road, theft** – Patrol on location from a call placed to the LPD office; no further information. Report taken
- **Lewiston Road, northbound**

– assist public – Caller to 911 an electric-powered vehicle, listed as an Audi Teal was disabled and out of power.

Wednesday, Dec. 1

- **Tuscarora/S. Fourth streets, suspicious activity** – Off-duty officer contacted 911 to report a 2003 Chevy Silverado seen driving in the neighborhood, and stopping in front of residences along the way for several minutes. When approached the males became confrontational. Responding patrol unable to locate the vehicle. Call cleared.
- **5700 block of Bridgeman Road, animal complaint** – Caller to 911 reported two horses in the roadway. Animals now in a field; caller/owner attempting to corral both animals and afraid the horses would escape again. Patrol responded.
- **4300 block of Lower River Road, disturbance non-domestic** – Caller to 911 reported being jumped by juveniles; negative on weapons. A female was listed as the main aggressor; subjects using marijuana. Patrols on location; report taken.

- **Locations at N. Ninth/Onondaga streets and N. Ninth/Center streets, vehicle/traffic stops** – Calls officer initiated. Patrol reported both drivers were cited for failure to stop at a stop sign violations. Uniform traffic tickets issued for Lewiston Town Court.

- **200 block of Glenvale Road, Youngstown, assist public**

– A 911 wireless caller reported subjects yelling in the background; possible domestic involving a male and female. Patrol spoke with a family member who stated all was OK and there no need for patrol's response.

- **1000 block of Sweet Home Road, forgery** – Caller reported an insurance policy was opened in his name and the policy was now in collections. Caller stated he never created said policy. Report taken.
- **Locations on the 1900 block of Mount Hope Road and at Porter Center/Langdon roads, traffic complaints** – Reports of trees down and blocking the roadway; problem handled by state DOT crews and subjects in vehicles.

- **5900 block of Tuscarora Road, animal complaint** – Caller reported dogs were barking for the past two hours; patrol requested, caller said the animals were neglected. Patrols checked area with negative results.
- **Ridge/Creek roads, vehicle/traffic stop** – Call officer initiated. Driver cited for speed in zone; vehicle clocked at 75 mph in a 40 mph zone. Uniform traffic ticket issued for Lewiston Town Court.

Friday, Dec. 3

- **Saunders Settlement/Lockport Junction roads, traffic complaint** – Caller to 911 reported the occupants of a tan Dodge Caravan, heading westbound had just threw an empty case of beer out of the window; bottles now all over the roadway. Patrol reported one suspect in custody for driving while intoxicated and sobriety testing refusal; Miranda warnings read. Tow requested with 12-hour hold. Report taken.
- **4700 block of N. Fifth Street, missing person** – Patrol respond-

ed to a 911 call; no further information.

- **4600 block of Creek Road, assist public** – Caller to 911 reported a 5-month-old infant was in a locked vehicle still running in the driveway. Towing service contacted; red Jeep listed.
- **Nesbitt Drive/Clark Street, suspicious activity** – Caller to 911 reported one truck and one vehicle, both suspicious, had left the area heading southbound on Miller Road towards the Town of Niagara. Patrol checked area with negative results.
- **Location not listed, suspicious activity** – Officer initiated call. Patrol reported a male, highly intoxicated was walking down the middle of the roadway. Subject provided a courtesy ride to a Porter Center Road residence.

Saturday, Dec. 4

- **5800 block of Garlow Road, suspicious activity** – Caller to 911 reported a male dressed in all black, with a black leather coat and black hair, took off running down towards the Lewiston No. 2 Fire Company headquarters complex.
- **4900 block of Callan Drive, 9-11 hang-up** – 911 dispatch following up on a call back reported a female answered, "it was my kids" and refused to provide her name. Responding patrols spoke with the female who said the children were playing with her cellphone and the call was accidental. A male then came to the door at the residence and became confrontational with patrol; subject advised to go back inside the house. Patrol handled the response and cleared the call.
- **Lewiston/Creek roads, assist public** – Officer initiated call. Patrol spoke with the rightful owner of vehicle regarding an insurance suspension on file with state DMV. Rightful owner stated the auto insurance was switched to a new carrier in July. The policy is now current; rightful owner was unaware of the DMV suspension, patrol advised to update her status.

Pennsylvania Avenue; the 2200 block of Saunders Settlement Road; and N. Eighth/Onondaga streets, vehicle/traffic stops – Calls officer initiated. Violations per stop included: driver cited for driving while intoxicated; rightful owner, speed in zone, vehicle clocked at 61 mph in a 45 mph zone; driver stopped and warned for backing up in middle of the intersection. Driver also charged with aggravated unlicensed operation, third. Appearance and uniform traffic tickets issued for Lewiston Town Court. Reports taken.

- **Niagara Scenic Parkway/Pletcher Road, MVA-injuries** – Caller to 911 reported a two-vehicle accident, northbound and said it look serious. Patrols on location.
