

Higgins: Grant opportunity for local fire departments

Congressman Brian Higgins announced the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) application period is now open. He invited local fire departments to apply before the deadline of 5 p.m. Friday, Feb. 12.

The AFG program provides competitive grants to fire departments and nonaffiliated EMS organizations to improve the effectiveness of firefighting operations, firefighter health and safety

programs, and to establish or expand fire prevention programs throughout the U.S. More than \$319 million has been designated for the AFG program during this current funding cycle.

"Our firefighters work tirelessly to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our community. While adapting to difficulties of the COVID-19 pandemic has presented numerous challenges, our local fire departments continue to

answer the call as selfless front-line responders," Higgins said. "This federal grant program will help Western New York fire departments secure additional resources to improve efficiency and safety."

The application period for AFG grants opened Jan. 4. All applications are submitted to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and go through a nonpartisan, merit-based review ranked

by factors established by a panel of fire service professionals.

For additional information on the 2020 AFG program, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will be hosting live webinars that will provide an overview of the program, as well as important reminders about how to navigate the grant application process – including tips for preparing an AFG application. ORDER CALLING PUBLIC HEARING TO BE HELD ON JANUARY 19, 2021 at 6:30 pm REGARDING THE PROPOSED ESTABLISHMENT OF THE TOWN OF NIAGARA WATER IMPROVEMENT AREA (WATER TANK 2021)

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Niagara (herein called "Town Board" and "Town", respectively), in the County of Niagara, New York, has, pursuant to Town Law Article 12-C, caused GHD (the "Engineer"), competent engineers duly licensed by the State of New York to prepare a preliminary map, plan and report for the establishment of the Town of Niagara Water Improvement Area (Water Tank 2021) (the "Water Improvement Area") and the construction of water improvements therein; and WHEREAS, the Engineer has completed and filed with the Town Board such preliminary map, plan and report and such preliminary map, plan and report is available for public inspection in the Office of the Town Clerk; and WHEREAS, such water system improvements project will generally consist of improvements to the Town's elevated water storage tank including, but not limited to, the cleaning and sandblasting

of the existing surfaces to remove paint coatings, welding and surface work to preserve the structural integrity of the water tank, painting of the water tank and all exterior structures, and the disinfection of the interior of the water tank, as well as other such improvements as more fully identified in (or contemplated by) such map, plan and report referred to above, all of the foregoing to include all necessary site work, equipment, apparatus and other improvements and costs incidental thereto and in connection with the financing thereof (collectively, the "Water Improvement"); and WHEREAS, the proposed Water Improvement will benefit the entire proposed Town of Niagara Water Improvement Area, which area is outside of any incorporated villages and is described as follows:

BEGINNING at the intersection of the southerly line of the Town of Lewiston with the northerly and easterly line of the City of Niagara Falls; thence easterly along the southerly line of the Town of Lewiston to a point in the southerly line of the Town of Lewiston and westerly line of the Town of Wheatfield; thence southerly along the westerly line of the Town of Wheatfield to a point located in the westerly line of the Town of Wheatfield and northerly line of the City of Niagara Falls to the place or point of beginning.

WHEREAS, the Engineer has estimated the total cost of the Water Improvement to be \$1,740,000; said cost to be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of the Town in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,740,000 offset by any federal, state, county and/or local funds received; and WHEREAS, the Town has complied with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations regarding environmental matters, including compliance with the New York State

Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), comprising Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and, in connection therewith, duly issued a negative declaration and/or other applicable documentation, and therefore, no further action under SEQRA is necessary; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, that a meeting of the Town Board of the Town be held at the Town Hall, 7105 Lockport Road, Niagara Falls, New York, on January 19, 2021, at ____ o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) to consider the establishment of the proposed Town of Niagara Water Improvement Area and the construction of the improvement therein, and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same and for such other action on the part of the Town Board with relation thereto as may be required by law; and be it

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Town Board may establish water rents/rates as provided in subdivision 12-a of Town Law Section 209-q and paragraph (d) of subdivision three of Town Law Section 198; and it is hereby FURTHER ORDERED, the estimated maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of the Town of Niagara Water Improvement Area shall be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of the Town in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,740,000 said amount to be offset by any federal, state, county and/or local funds, and unless paid from other sources or charges (including, but not limited to, water rents/rates), the costs of said establishment shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection from the several lots and parcels of land within the Niagara Water Improvement Area for such purpose in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable, except as otherwise

provided by law; and be it FURTHER ORDERED, that the Town Clerk publish at least once in the newspaper designated as the official newspaper of the Town for such publication, and post on the sign board of the Town maintained pursuant to subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law, a copy of this Order, certified by said Town Clerk, the first publication thereof and said posting to be not less than ten nor more than 20 days before the date of such public hearing.
