

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

The following activity occurred Monday, Nov. 1, to Sunday Nov. 7, as reported by the Lewiston Police Department. LPD reported 227 response calls during this period. For more information on arrests and other activity, visit the Lewiston Police Department's mobile app or its page on Facebook.

Monday, Nov. 1

- **600 block of Blairville Road, MVA-injuries** – Caller reported a vehicle struck a telephone pole. Patrol reported the rightful owner of the vehicle was charged with driving while intoxicated. Suspect released on an appearance ticket for Lewiston Town Court.
- **2500 block of Moore Road, damage to property** – Caller to 911 reported all four tires were found slashed on two vehicles overnight. Caller also said one vehicle also had long scratches on the driver's side; plate number logged.
