

## LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

### LPD advisory on juvenile behavior

In response to a rash of complaints received from Lewiston residents regarding the behavior of juveniles in the village, the Lewiston Police Department issued the following online advisory on its police app and Facebook page.

"Over recent weeks we have received numerous complaints of juveniles roaming village streets after 9 p.m. and causing disturbances and vandalism. As a reminder to parent (the) village ordinance states that no child 16 or younger may be out in public in the village without a parent or guardian after 9 p.m. Violations of this ordinance can result in a citation issued to the parents."

LPD advises residents having questions or complaints to contact the department at 716-754-8477 or call 911.

**Mohawk streets; the 2800 block of Saunders Settlement Road and the 4000 block of Creek Road, vehicle/traffic stops** - Calls officer initiated. Violations per stop included: driver, failure to stop at stop sign; driver, failure to stop at stop sign; and last two drivers, failure to yield violations. Uniform traffic tickets issued for Lewiston Town Court.

#### Tuesday, Nov. 16

**Bronson Road/Dana Drive, vehicle/traffic stop** - Call officer initiated. Driver cited for driving with more than .08 of 1% BAC, driving while intoxicated and failure to use a designated lane. Appearance tickets issued for Lewiston Town Court. Report taken.
