

LEWISTON POLICE BLOTTER

SUMMARY OF REFUNDING BOND RESOLUTION

Set forth below is a summary of said resolution adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Wheatfield, Niagara County, New York (the "County"), on September 14, 2020.

1. The resolution is entitled "REFUNDING BOND

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF WHEATFIELD, NIAGARA COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "TOWN") AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING BONDS OF THE TOWN IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$2,950,000 PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN RELATION THERETO AND THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS TO BE REFUNDED THEREBY".

2. The resolution authorizes the issuance of refunding bonds in the principal amount not to exceed \$2,950,000 for the purpose of refunding the outstanding principal amount of the Town's \$7,205,000 Public Improvement (Serial) Bonds, Series 2011, dated and issued on January 13, 2011 (the "Refunded Bonds") for the specific class of objects or purposes identified below, which Refunded Bonds have an aggregate outstanding principal amount of \$2,830,000.
3. The Refunded Bonds were issued for the following specific object or purpose, or class of objects or purposes, and for the following period of probable usefulness:
 - (1) replacement of existing roofs at

the Town Hall and Highway Garage 25 years

- (2) purchase and installation of approximately 3,300 water meters 20 years
- (3) rehabilitation of Klemer Road and Witmer Road pump stations; and the construction of surface draining improvements 40 years
- (4) construction of a new building for the Water and Sewer Department and the construction of a Youth Center 30 years
- (5) purchase of certain lands within the Town for use as parklands 30 years
- (6) the purchase of certain equipment and vehicles for use by the Town's Highway Department; certain road reconstruction and repaving improvements

The resolution summarized herein, including the refunding financial analysis attached thereto, shall be available for public inspection during normal business hours at the office of the Town Clerk, Town of Wheatfield, 2800 Church Road, North Tonawanda, New York 14120.
